

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

#### AFRICAN-AMERICAN DOCTORS **WORKING ON GARLIC HIV THERAPIES**

From a report by Bob Lederer that appeared in Outweek's January 16

Because garlic has been used medicinally in numerous cultures throughout the world for thousands of years (it is helpful in preventing colds. flu, anemia, hypertension, and several cancers), and because current research indicates that garlic has strong anti-viral, anti-bacterial, and Immune-stimulating qualities, some holistic health practitioners consider that garlic might be useful in treating AIDS. Hundreds of PWA's have experimented with nutritional and herbal programs including garlic, ranging from three to eight cloves a day (raw, as cooking detracts from garlic's medicinal value). Others take capsules, tablets, or liquid extracts. But there has been minimal research on garlic as an HIV remedy in the US. In China, where garlic's medicinal importance was first recognized, garlic has been effective in treating non-AIDSrelated cases of three common opportunistic infections widespread among PWA's: CMV, thrush, and cryptococcal

Since 1987, a leading Chinese expert, Dr. Lu Pao Pei, has been in correspondence with a team of African-American scientists—Taraq Abdullah, of the Akbar Research Foundation in Pax-

ton, Florida, and Dahlia Kirkpatrick and James Carter, both of Tulane. The American researchers did a preliminary three-month study using aged garlic tablets to treat AIDS, for which the National Institutes of Health turned down a requested small-business loan. Results: the seven PWA's who completed the study all benefited in some way, in increased T-4 cell counts, immune modulating effects, or in heightened natural killer cell activity. Dr. Abdullah, turned down by AmFAR for a grant, went to China to meet Dr. Lu, who had developed a purified garlic extract for IV use. Based on the Chinese research and their own study, the African-American scientists developed a protocol for a year-long clinical trial of intravenous garlic extracts in HIV-positive people. African-American health activists, among them Rasheeda Abdul Hakeem, Sheila George, Cliff Goodman, formed AANTA, African Americans for Natural Therapies In AIDS to make this and other treatments available to communities of color. In August of 1990, AANTA sponsored a public forum featuring Dr. Carter of Tulane.

At Xavier University's Pharmacology Department, animal toxicological tests have begun with the purified garlic extracts. The scientists have applied to the Institutional Review Board, or IRB, of the Great Lakes Medical Group in Chicago for approval of the protocol.

Evidence supporting garlic's potential against HIV is strong. With the research done by the African-American doctors, the AIDS community may have a crucial weapon in both prevention and treatment for the opportunistic infections that make AIDS do life-threatening.

#### ASPIRIN THERAPY FOR HIV?

Aspirin, in very low doses, greatly enhances production of gamma interferon and interleukin-2 in the human body, according to a study conducted by immunologists from George Washington University and the University of Virginia and published nearly two years ago in The Bulletin of the New York Academy of Medicine. Results as printed indicate that gamma interferon production is increased over 300% and interleukin-2 production increased over 200% in test volunteers who took a dose of aspirin (325 mg.) every other Some HIV-positive Individuals obtained dramatic short-term results in improving their T4 cell counts using aspirin therapy.

According to Howard Armistead, Executive Director of GALAPAC, a gay political action committee, his T4 cell count and T4/T8 cell ratio improved by over 60% after two and a half months of aspirin therapy. "I went from a T4 count of 556 to a count of 895, and from a T4/T8 ratio of .56 to a ratio of .92 in just two and a half months on one regular aspirin a day," he said. "I was amazed. I only hope that aspirin therapy will help others too. This will be a major step forward in HIV therapy if aspirin proves to be as effective in other people

A community-based drug trial group in Los Angeles is planning to begin aspirin test trials immediately. John James, publisher of AIDS Treatment

News, is helping to coordinate the study and preliminary findings are due out by the middle of this year. Meanwhile, it is anticipated that aspirin will become a drug of choice for combination therapy because of its interferon and interleukin-

producing properties.

According to the George Washington/Virignia study, one aspirin every other day was the optimal dose for in creasing interferon and interfeukin 2 production. Higher doses of aspirin tended to decrease, rather than h crease, the production of these two chemicals by the body. However, Ar. chemicals by the body. However, Ar. mistead reported that he experienced his sharp increase in T4 counts using a dosage of one buffered aspirin per day

Several questions about aspirin Several questions therapy remain to be answered. First will aspirin therapy be as effective for people with very low T4 cell counts as it is for people with only moderately impaired T-cell counts? Secondly, will aspirin's effectiveness in producing an immune-enhancing response wear of after a few months, or will it last for after a few moinins, or will it last for years? Thirdly, will all moderately impaired HIV-positive persons see benefits, and if not, what factors would inhibit or enhance immunological response to aspirin?

If aspirin does indeed prove to produce significant positive effects for a large portion of the HIV population, implications are widespread. First, aspirin would become a major new component of combination therapy with other drugs in the fight against HIV. Secondly, delaying the onset of ARC and AIDS may be significantly lengthened, and the expense of HIV intervention may be reduced. Finally, the third world will have an affordable means of fighting HIV for the first time.



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#### LIFE UPON THE WICKED STAGE

This year's very brief period between the Christmas and Carnival seasons has several local theatres simultaneously in production, and the curiously mixed-bag of recent openings has included a spirited South African musical, a rarely-produced bitter comedy from a Pulitzer winner of the '70s, and a play that is picaresque in form as well as in its own history, since it is making the rounds of regional theatres and intentionally avoiding New York.

Sarafinal, the South African musical billed as "the music of liberation," is a work that defies any normal critical standards. The major problematic area is that its undeniable high spirits and emotional appeal are derived from an Intrinsic intellectual naivete. The musical concerns a township highschool classroom which seeks to win a year-end school competition by staging a futuristic play about the day Nelson Mandela is released from jail and freedom finally comes to an Africa that has been "burning in the sun."

Of course, much has changed since Sarafina! was conceived: Mandela is out of detention, but South Africa, in spite of a few tentative moves by the government, is hardly approaching the optimistic vision of freedom the show's participants and creators foresaw. Indeed the ever-increasing inter-tribal frictions there, the tarnished image of Mandela's wife Winnie, and the experience of democracy in the rest of Black Africa make it reasonable to reject the show's major thrust. But then, the so-called American Dream is hardly completely realized after 200 years either, yet it is kept alive by an idealism that sometimes ignores facts.

ful in amassing evidence of apartheid's Inhumanity, eventually becomes tiresomely redundant). The structural problem is also related to another dificulty for observers: the show's intriguing exoticism often impedes understanding, for these tales are told in dialect that may defy comprehension.

Provided one is willing to make adjustments for these problems—not an easy task in audiences as talkative and mobile as those of New Orleans—the show can be richly rewarding. Even if one minds making necessary adjustments too demanding, Sarafinal can be a delight just in the power of its dynamic choral music, its exciting blend of jazz and traditional African sound, and in the visual splendor of the last several minutes, when students cast off their black and white uniforms and don tribal attire.

The shows mounted locally at the Marigny and the CAC are both flawed plays, but at least one is satiric and caustic enough to entertain. And Miss Reardon Drinks A Little is a work from the pen of Paul Zindel, a writer best-known as a novelist for teenagers (Pigman, You're Stepping On My Eyeball, etc.) Miss Reardon doesn't quite measure up to the prize-winning form of his earlier play, The Effect of Gamma Rays..., yet it is somewhat reminiscent of Beth Henley's Crimes of the Heart (both deal with three eccentric sisters whose humor borders on the grotesque).


What makes the play and the production of special interest to our city at this time is that it is basically about the profession of education, a subject that has certainly occupied the public mind in recent months, what with the strike and

Sarafinal succeeds then when white audiences surrender jaded sophistication to the enthusiasm and hope that are so engagingly and exuberantly displayed by the youthful cast. An audience must also surrender a natural expectation for a traditional theatrical structure of story, for this is a "concept musical," in which parts of the concept work very effectively (such as the use of the band as the guards outside the township), and some parts do not (the repeated use of individual stories of repression, while use-

the regular circus provided by the School Board. The three sisters here are all teachers, and all are in personal crises because of their jobs. One has sold her soul to the system, becoming a heartless and corrupt administrator ready to cover up any scandal that may indirectly touch her. Another is a lonely neurotic who in her desperation has created the scandal by making advances to a student. The third Miss Reardon is an alcoholic burntout case, in rebellion against the system that has frustrated her and warped her





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sisters' personalities.

Unfortunately, Zindel doesn't do much with these characters but define them; there is no resolution of the conflict here, but along the way there is a lot of funny and bitchy dialogue, much of which strikes home with anyone remotely familiar with educational politics. My favorite was a barb aimed at the over-paid, overdressed, unproductive administrative types (known in New Orleans as "purse ladies" for the designer handbags they carry to their long lunches). Miss Reardon lashes out at one such character as a "Sheena, Queen of the Blackboard Jungle."

If the play never quite gels, it nevertheless entertains with performances that are broad but not too overwrought, especially since there is delicious irony in the csting of a local educator in the title role. Miss Reardon may not be great art, but it is certainly a worthy vehicle for satirizing our local not-so-sacred educational cow.

The most recent production at the CAC reinforces the growing realization that ever since the renovation of the Contemporary Arts Center began, its theatre program has been in a state of decline. T-Bone and Weasel is yet another marcher in the parade of second-rate, undistinguished plays which has included Brilliant Traces, Life During Wartime and Fefu. I can't imagine what criteria are employed in the selection of properties for production, but I would rather believe that the process involves favors to friends and col-

leagues, or even to find oalish roles within the limited range of the CAC's thesplan sine qua non Kenn Norman, than simple lack of literary taste.

Jon Klein's T-Bone is a major disappointment—the first CAC production in quite some time which matches an inadequate script with an inadequate performance, the story of two ex-cons on the loose in the backwoods South follows in the time-honored tradition of the picaresque adventure, which has so often recurred in American literature, from the first American novel (Brackenridge's Modern Chivalry) to the much underestimated A Cool Million by Nathanael West, and including our closest approximation to a national epic. Huckleberry Finn. Unlike those works, however, there is no dramatic movement here to accompany the characters' physical movement: they learn nothing. we learn nothing-the action is completely circular, ending where it began.

On their peregrinations, the two simple-minded cons encounter and are conned by a series of stock characters of the rural South: the evangelical minister, the corrupt politician, the fast-talking used-car salesman. The playwright offers only one new twist on these cliches—an implausible and offensive effort to make his demagogue an environmentalist. The rest are simply uninspired retreads of familiar cartoons. Though Rabbi Williams tries valiantly tocarry the play as he limns all the minor roles, he is given little support by the

writer or by his fellow players. Richard Watson is totally lacking in technique: Mr. Norman rehashes the mugging routine he has used in previous performances. Mark McLaughlin, who was originally cast in the roles now taken by Williams. Is probably better off to have injured his shoulder in an auto accident than his reputation in the bumper car that is part of the set, which otherwise consists of a slap-dash paint job suggestive of what a group of fourth-graders might do in a two-hour arts project.

Let us hope for a change of course at the CAC—soon.



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#### BROADLY SPEAKIN

By Betty Mansfield Hating Our Own I can't work with faggots. They're just impossible.

I hate going into a public restroom and there's some queen standing at the urinal next to you.

I can't believe you would give up your husband and your house and go off and live with some woman. Don't you have any self-respect?
You don't look like a lesbian.
Homophobic remarks like these make

because they come from the mouths of

gay men and lesbians.

The usual aim of satire, as personified by the little satyr with his spear, is to poke fun at those who are different from us, those who seem to threaten the safe-ty or the mores of our culture. Why then, do we gays and lesbians, as a subculture, so often satirize, criticize, condemn, or exclude those who are our own kind?

Why do gay men so often like to "camp it up"? (The word camp originally

toward one's self or one's own kind. Now it applies mainly to gay men, who, for some reason, seem to be the ones quickest to make fun of themselves.) Maybe it's because some men are afraid to take their femininity too seriously; society, after all, tends to place more value on those things considered masculine. Maybe it's a way of taking all of society's ridicule and turning it from something hateful into something fun. Oh, girlfriend! They do seem to have

Of course, actions speak louder than words. Consider these typical scenarios:

A drag queen walks into a gay bar. Two guys at the other end of the bar turn to each other and start laughing derisively.

A lesbian who's new to the communi-

Everyone seems to be part of a clique which is okay with her, but she'd like to be a part of those cliques. She stays and has a drink or two, but no one says hello. She leaves feeling lonelier than

We divide and conquer our own community. When I came out, it was like moving to a small town: everyone seemed to know everyone else's business, and everyone had some kind of judgement to pass. Where I expected sisterhood, there was the same jealousy and competition that straight women heap on themselves. Where I expected friendship, there was suspicion. I discovered that many in our community hate lesbians who are butch, lesbians who are 'femme,' gay men who are 'queens,' and gay men who are 'macho'—in other words, anyone who doesn't conform to somebody else's rigid definitions of our sex roles.

Also hated in our community are bisexuals, older people, younger people, blacks, the 'politically correct,' the politically incorrect.' Is it any wonder that so many gays never come out of the closet? Is it any wonder that so many of us have drug or alcohol dependencies? How can we behave intolerantly toward each other and then expect straights to

But maybe we've all become a little defensive. Maybe we've come to expect the worst. Maybe we just need to put forward a little more effort toward


understanding each other.

#### **US DONATES \$242,000 TO** AIDS PREVENTION PROGRAM

IN SOWETO, SOUTH AFRICA
The United States has made a
\$242,000 grant to the Township AIDS Program in Soweto, South Africa, that country's largest black township; the money will be used for prevention/education. The grant was signed on January 13 by Robert W. Roskens, Administrator of the United States Agency for International Development. Roskens is visiting South Africa with Health and Human Services Secretary Dr. Louis Sullivan, on a fact-finding mission examining local efforts in Africa to combat AIDS and to improve infant mortality and child survival. (You'd think they'd

check out their own back yards first.)
While the South African overnment's Department of National Health and Population Development has confirmed only 613 cases of AIDS (270 of them reported in the last year). Dr. Paul Grundy, a State Department physician, estimated that as many as 500,000 South Africans could be HIVpositive by the end of this year.

Refiloe Serote, who set up the Township AIDS Program, said the program, said the program. gram would be 'rescued' by the American money, since the South African government provides no help-The project was begun in 1989 with a grant from the Norwegian government and later donations from American and British sources.

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



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#### MINNEAPOLIS ARCHDIOCESE GETS FINE FOR ANTI-GAY BIAS

The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Minneapolis/St. Paul was ordered to pay a \$20,000 fine to the gay Catholic group Dignity for violating its members civil rights when the Archdiocese kicked Dignity out of its meeting space in the Newman Center of the University of Minnesota. The Minneapolis Commission on Civil Rights said that the expulsion violated the city's gay rights law which bans, among other things, hous ling discrimination based on sexual orientation. The city also fined the church \$15,000 in a civil fine. The Archdiocese plans to appeal the ruling alleging that its First Amendment right to freedom of religion has been infringed. The \$20,000 fine includes \$8,50 in punitive damages, \$100 in actual damages, and \$10,850.38 in legal expenses.

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
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#### FILM TIPS

The Godfather Part III: Francis Coppolate third installment looks splendid.


